

KEEP IT CLEAN

There are many steps that you can take to make your smoking experience all that much better. I am here to tell you just a few that can make a big difference.

First & foremost, cleaning the bowl head of your glass piece every time you use it can keep it from resinizing when you finish smoking just wipe out the basin. I have found almost anything works, in a pinch you can use the bottom of your pants, a napkin, or toilet paper works as well. This routine will keep you from unnecessarily smoking resin when there is still bud in the world.

Pending on your smoking habits thoroughly cleaning your glass piece is something that should be done every 1 or 2 weeks. There are cleaning products out on the market now but they are over priced. Rubbing alcohol works wonders (it also costs 99¢ a bottle) soak your glass piece in a bowl of rubbing alcohol until it comes clean. Now there maybe some hard to reach spaces for that:

Pipe Cleaners (not just good for arts & crafts but actually useful in cleaning pipes) they move in any direction & all those little fuzzies pick up a lot. After your piece is completely clean make sure to run some water through it, so your bud doesn't taste like rubbing alcohol. Sit back & enjoy a nice clean glass hit.


If you own a bong I hope you all do, here's some great advice... **CHANGE THE BONG WATER !!!** I'm not talking about when it's gotten so thick you can't see through it either. Every 5 or so bong hits, pending on size is good for proper maintenance. Ice is also a very nice touch, but remember, ice melts!

These are simple but effective steps can make the bud you smoke taste better & keep your piece from getting goopy. If you have a wooden bowl, my advice is to throw it away! There is just no need. (Until next time...)

The Comma (,) is used: 1) between short independent clauses in parallel construction and between clauses joined by the conjunctions *and*, *but*, *yet*, *nor*, etc.; 2) after a fairly long dependent clause that precedes an independent one; 3) before and after a dependent clause that comes in the middle of a sentence; 4) to set off a nonrestrictive word, phrase, or clause; 5) to set off transitional words and phrases; 6) to separate words, phrases, or clauses in series; 7) to set off the one spoken to in direct address; 8) to set off a direct quotation; 9) to set off titles, addresses, names of places, dates, etc.; 10) after the salutation in an informal letter; 11) after the complimentary close of letters.

The Semicolon (;) is used: 1) in compound sentences between independent clauses that are not joined by connectives, or when such clauses are joined by conjunctive adverbs; 2) to separate phrases or clauses that are broken by internal punctuation.

The Colon (:) is used: 1) to introduce a long series; 2) before a lengthy quotation; 3) between chapter and verse, volume and page, hour and minute, etc.; 4) after the salutation of a business letter.

The Question Mark (?) is used: 1) after a direct question; 2) to show uncertainty or doubt.

The Exclamation Mark (!) is used after a word, phrase, or sentence to indicate strong emotion, surprise, etc.

The Hyphen (-) is used: 1) to separate the parts of a compound word or numeral; 2) to indicate syllabification.

The Dash (—) is used: 1) to show a break in continuity; 2) between numbers, dates, times, places, etc. that mark limits.

Quotation Marks (" ") are used: 1) to enclose a direct quotation; 2) to enclose the titles of articles, short stories, short poems, etc., or divisions or chapters of books, periodicals, long poems, etc.

Italic Type is used: 1) to set off the titles of books, periodicals, newspapers, etc.; 2) to indicate foreign words or phrases.


The Apostrophe (') is used: 1) to indicate an omitted letter or letters in a word or contraction; 2) to add an *s* to form the possessive case of all nouns that do not end in an *s* or *z* sound; 3) with an added *s* to form the possessive of monosyllabic, singular nouns that end in an *s* or *z* sound; 4) without an added *s* to form the possessive of all nouns that end in an *s* or *z* sound except monosyllabic, singular forms and forms ending in *-ce*; 5) to form the plurals of letters, numbers, etc.

Parentheses () are used: 1) to enclose nonessential material in a sentence; 2) to enclose letters or numbers of reference as in an outline form.

Brackets [] are used to indicate insertions, comments, corrections, etc. made by a person other than the original author of the material.

A Capital Letter is used: 1) to begin a sentence, or a quotation or direct question within a sentence; 2) to begin every word in all proper nouns; 3) to begin every word, except conjunctions, articles, and short prepositions that are not the first word, in the names of books, magazines, works of music or art, business agencies, religions, holidays, etc.; 4) to begin every word in the names of days, months, eras, etc.; 5) in many abbreviations; 6) to begin nouns and pronouns referring to the Deity; 7) to begin all salutations and all complimentary closes of letters.


