It took me close to 4 years to go through every blonde & brown hefore I got completely bored & discovered RED! There are definitely pluses & minuses to the fiery tones. Most guys have something for red heads, it gives off the impression of attitude, & an easy color to pull off once you find the shade that works best for you. There are many different types of red, from a deep auburn to an intense orange to a strawberry blonde; it's an easy way for people to express themselves in a "normal" colorful way. Kiss Before Dying I decided it was worth it to me, but I've been doing it for years & have much experience. I started dying my hair when I was about 13 as opposed to going to the salon. The good thing about purple is that it keeps its intensity a little longer than the red that tends to fade to a general coppery color after a while if not properly maintained. Be careful though a red based purple (or blonde) vs. the violet, blue, or ash base will give you the same effect as the red dyes when bleaching or stripping the color from your hair. Instead of taking your hair down to a neutral blonde or white, it turns it a light shade of orange. I learned about bleaching when I learned about extreme color & my addiction to it. Believe it or not even purple started to seem like a normal color & I began to move through the rest of the rainbow. Blue, red, yellow, fluorescent pink, green, tyedyed as my grandma called it. 



same time! How can you be Colooking @ the road when you're looking @ a book? If your test was THAT important you would have studied last night.


TURN SIGNALS are not optional, use them. They are the law you know.


