

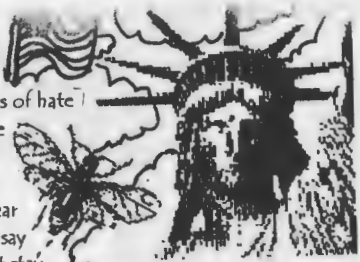
Summertime... and the living's smurfy!

Toking Terminology

Bowl: a pipe for smoking weed
Bong (water pipe): a tube, usually 3 in. to 10 ft., that filters smoke through water
Carb(uretor): hole in bong or bowl when released clears smoke from the chamber
Chamber: section in a piece where the smoke collects
Head: cup like spot where you put the pot
Stem: attached to the head of a bong it's the cylinder that sucks the smoke through the H2O
Mouthpiece: where you put your mouth
Joint: pot rolled in a paper
Blunt: bud rolled in a cigar wrapper
Dugout: wooden box w/ 2 compartments, one holding a spring loaded metal bat & one for storing broken up weed
Bat(ton) or One Hitter: small tube for taking one toke at a time
Sneak-a-Toke or Bullet: small cylindrical metal bowl w/ a screw on cap & rubber mouth piece
Chill'um: sort of like a bat, it's got a bigger head & is smoked between your fingers in a fist, most commonly made from glass
Toke Stone: a polished rock w/ a hole carved through it for holding a joint
Shotgun: placing the lit end of a joint or blunt in your mouth & forcing the smoke into a friend's lungs either through the mouth or nose
Sherlock: a curved pipe resembling that of the famous detective
Bubbler: a pipe w/ a chamber for water
Hooka: a bong-like device usually with multiple tubes & mouthpieces, & a bigger bowl head where burning coals can cook your cannabis
Roach: the end that's left when you've smoked the joint or blunt down as far as you want
Poker: stick used for clearing out the stem after smoking
Slide: head & stem combined that can easily be removed & replaced to clear the chamber instead of a carb
Toke, Hit, Puff, Choke: noun or verb for intake of smoke
Rotation: the reoccurring order in which the pot is passed
Gravity Bong: a bong usually homemade from a 2 liter bottle & a sneak-a-toke which uses water pressure to pull the smoke into the chamber & then by pushing it down forces the smoke into your lungs

18th Century artist, poet, activist, & visionary, William Blake is probably best known (nowadays) for his poetry collections *Songs of Innocence* and *Songs of Experience*. Herb Dumplings

Round, long, fat or skinny, shape them as you please.

- 4 oz. (115g) wholemeal flour
- 1/2 oz. (15g) vegetable margarine
- 1 tsp. baking powder
- 1 tsp. fresh chives
- 1 tsp. fresh thyme
- 1 tsp. fresh coriander
- other "fresh herbs" as desired
- cold water

Sift flour & baking powder into a bowl. Rub in vegetable margarine until well blended. Finely chop the fresh herbs & add to the mixture together with sufficient cold water to bind the ingredients & produce a soft dough. Lightly knead the dough on a floured surface until smooth. Divide the mixture, shape into dumplings & drop them into boiling water. Cook for about 10 minutes.

- 3 ripe avocados
- juice 1/2 lime
- 1 1/2 pt (850ml) milk
- 4-5 mint leaves
- freshly ground black pepper

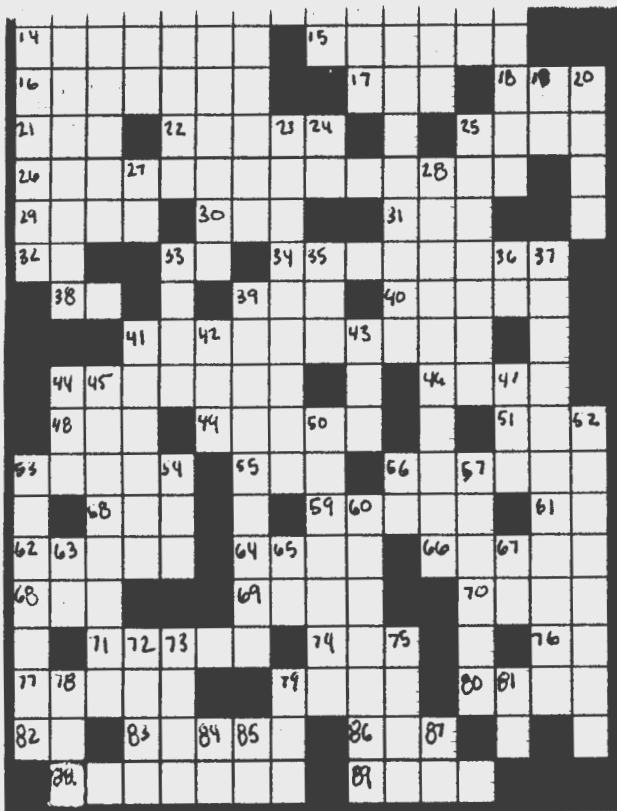
Halve the avocados, remove the seed & scoop out the flesh. Mash the avocados w/ the lime juice to make a puree, transfer to an electric blender & blend mixture while pouring in the milk. Liquidize until ingredients are thoroughly blended. Stir in the chopped mint leaves & season w/ fresh ground pepper. Chill until ready to serve.

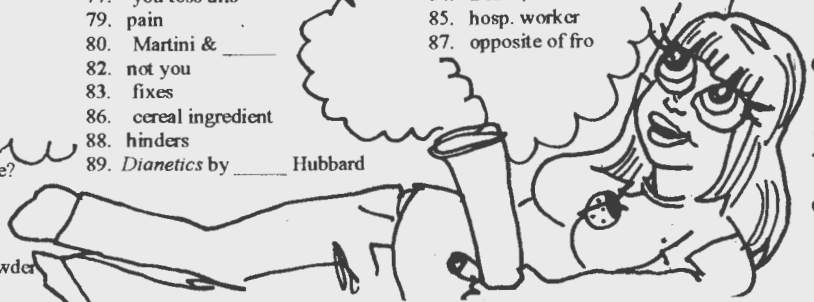

But just because you get frisky does fornication necessarily need to follow? No,

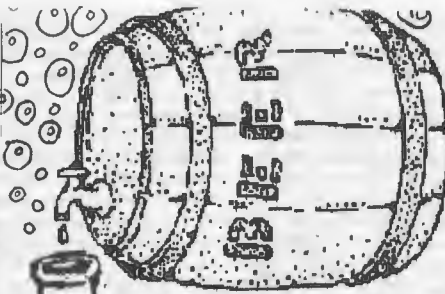

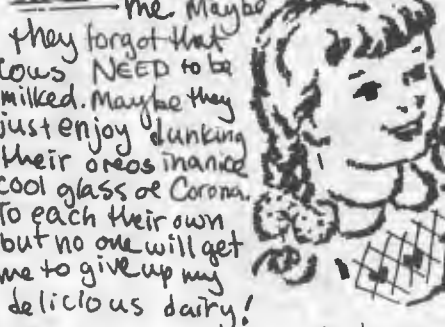
